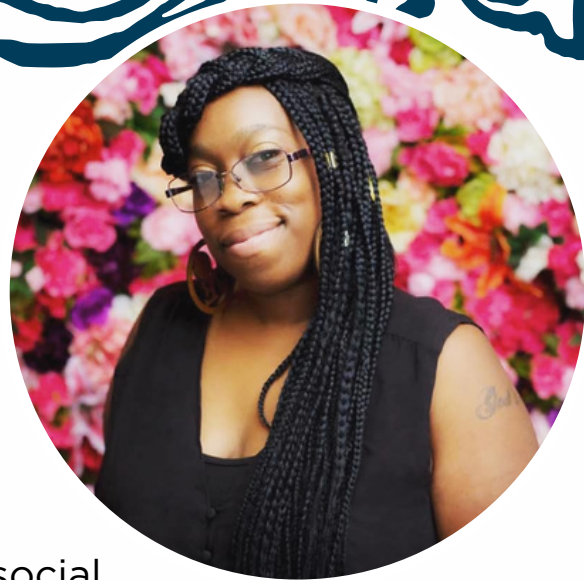


Kai Sutton
