Stephanie Wan is an Assistant United States Attorney with the United States Attorney's Office - Western District of Missouri. She is assigned to the Violent Crimes Unit handling gun crimes, violent crime, and child sexual exploitation crimes. She has been an AUSA since December 2020. Prior to joining the US Attorney's Office, she spent thirteen years as an Assistant Prosecuting Attorney with the Greene County Prosecutor's Office, most recently serving as the Chief Assistant Prosecuting Attorney. As both a state and federal prosecutor, Stephanie specializes in prosecuting the sexual and physical abuse of children, sex trafficking, sexual abuse against adults, domestic violence, and violent crimes, including homicides. As an AUSA, she is the Project Safe Neighborhood co-coordinator for the Western District of Missouri. Since 2014, Stephanie has taught at Missouri State University as a per course instructor teaching "Forensic Psychology: Child Abuse and the Law." She earned her J.D. from the University of Missouri-Columbia School of Law and her undergraduate degree from Vanderbilt University.



Stephanie has been recognized with the Missouri Lawyers Weekly Women's Justice Award - Public Service Award in April 2020, with the Missouri Bar Foundation Lon O. Hocker Trial Advocacy Award in September 2019, and the Missouri Lawyers Weekly Up & Coming Award in October 2016. She is a POST certified instructor and has taught at the Springfield Police Department Police Academy, the Missouri Investigators Association, and the Department of Justice's Law Enforcement Community Coordination Conference. Stephanie has also had the pleasure of providing training to the Springfield Public Schools on the topic of adverse childhood experiences and their link to violent crime.

Stephanie is a member of Leadership Springfield Signature Class 33. She is a past president of the Leadership Springfield board. Stephanie also serves on the Rosie committee. In addition to her work, Stephanie also serves on The Victim Center Board of Directors, as the co-chair of the Missouri Supreme Court's Joint Commission on Women in the Profession, and as a member of the Southern Missouri Women's Law Association, the Springfield Metropolitan Bar Association, and the Missouri Bar.
